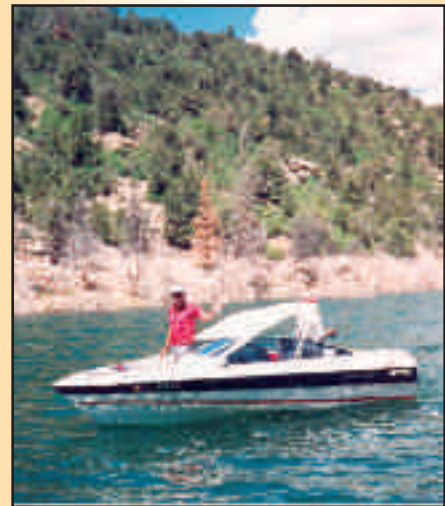

Welcome to McPhee Recreation Area

McPhee Lake offers a wide variety of experiences. With over fifty miles of shoreline, McPhee Lake is the largest reservoir on the San Juan National Forest and the second largest in the state of Colorado. This means there are plenty of opportunities for water lovers to enjoy a variety of water sports, including boating, water skiing, sailing, flat water canoeing, and fishing.

Whether you fish from the bank or by boat, you are sure to catch something with the wide variety of warm and cold water species McPhee Lake has to offer, including; Rainbow trout, Kokanee Salmon, Bass and Panfish.

McPhee Lake has two large Recreation Areas; McPhee and House Creek, which offer developed boat ramps and campground facilities. There are several areas around the lake accessible only by boat, that offer a back-country experience as well as day use areas that are accessible by vehicle.

McPhee Campground is located on a mesa 500 feet above the lake, with road access to the boat launch area.

Rules and Regulations

Remember These Rules:

- **Overtaking/Passing:** Boat being passed has right-of-way.
- **Meeting Head-On:** Keep to the right.
- **Crossing:** Boat on the right has right-of-way. Slow down and permit it to cross. Remember.....courtesy pays!
- Forest Service and State Parks are not available for boat rescue.
- **Skipper is alert & SOBER...**and in right frame of mind.
- Colorado State boating and fishing regulations apply on McPhee Lake.
- Bass 10-15" **must** be released.
- Camping debris and trash in dispersed areas must be carried out.
- Human waste disposal: Please stay at Least 100 feet from high water line. Dig a small hole about 8" deep. Cover it with soil after using.
- Please dump sewage in appropriate receptacles. A waste disposal station is located at the McPhee and House Creek Campgrounds.
- Campfires are restricted to fire grates in the developed campgrounds and to within the high water line when using dispersed areas.
- **Wakeless Zones:** Located in House Creek, Dry Canyon and Beaver Creek arms, in the Sage Hen fisherman access area (fish habitat) and around the boat ramps.

Enjoy your visit here. Please keep these things in mind:

- **Sun:** Watch out, sunburn occurs very easily at this altitude.
- **Water Temperature:** Hypothermia is a constant threat in cold water combined with high winds.
- **Navigational Hazards:** As with any lake there may be hazards such as floating debris and shallow water depths. Exercise caution!!

Location: 15 miles north of Dolores, on the east shoreline, off the Dolores-Norwood Road (FR #526)

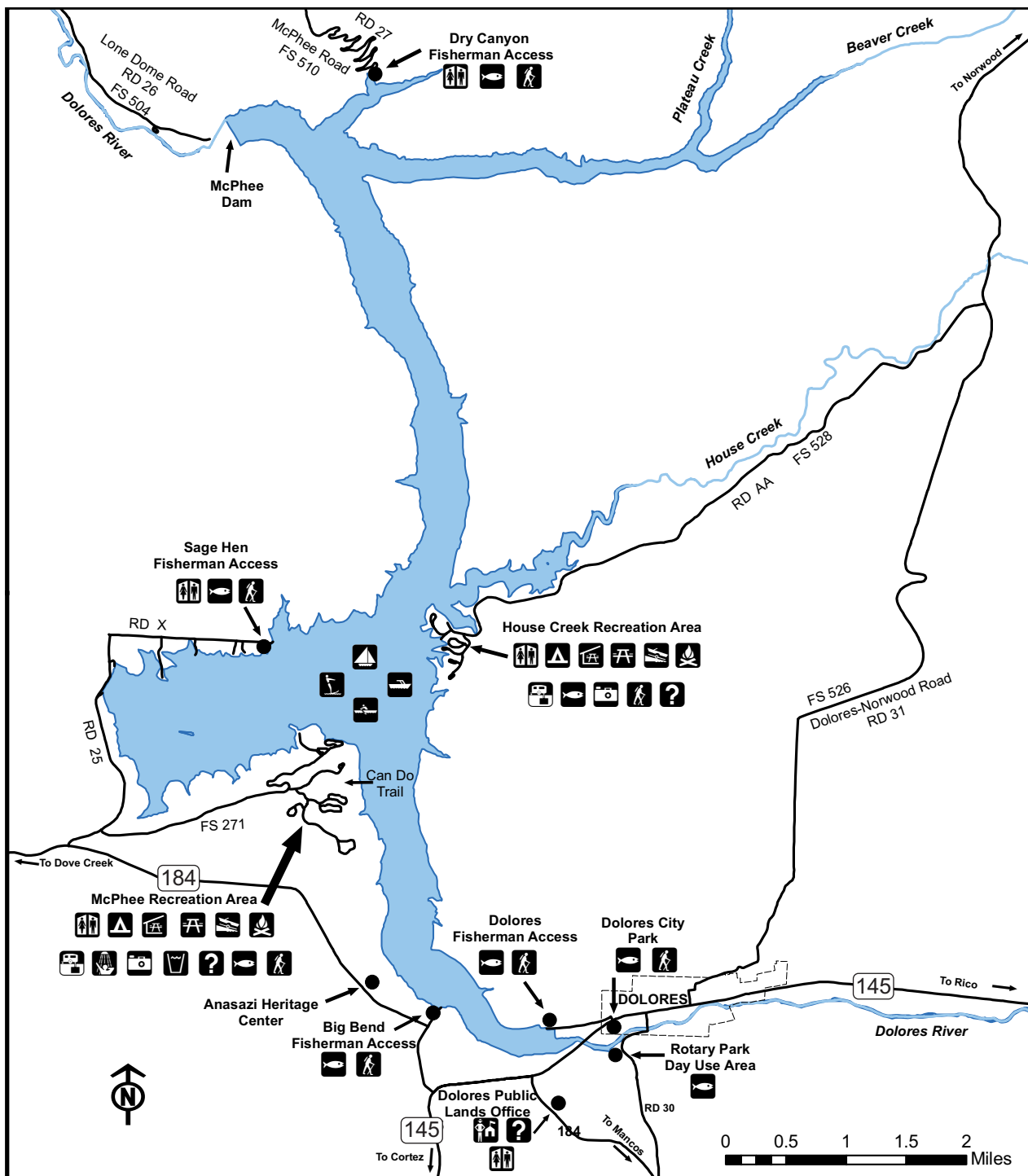
DAY USE AREAS

- **Dry Canyon Fisherman Access**
15 unit graveled parking area, toilet
- **Dolores Fisherman Access**
20 unit graveled parking area
- **Big Bend Fisherman Access**
Two 10 unit graveled parking area
- **Rotary Park**
River access, park in designated parking only
- **Sage Hen Fisherman Access**
Graveled parking, toilet. Area closed dusk to dawn.

Water Skiing: Due to the speed necessary for water skiing, this activity is restricted to the main body of the reservoir or high speed areas. Conflicts between uses of the reservoir may occur. Please respect all uses and provide adequate space.

SAFETY FIRST! TRIP CHECKLIST

- Before going afloat, check equipment to see that it is loaded correctly.
- Be sure not to overload the vessel.
- Fire Extinguisher and Safety Equipment aboard and accessible
- Coast Guard approved PFD (life jacket) for each person on board
- Lines coiled and out of way
- Ample fuel in tanks
- Paddles or oars on board
- Lights or whistles work
- Water is bailed and boat does not leak
- Bilges clean, clear, free from gasoline vapors
- No fuel leaks and any spilled gasoline wiped up
- Weather OK for boating
- Gear fastened and out of the way
- Passengers seated: boat trim
- Propeller clean of weeds, rock, impediments
- Motor safety chain attached to boat
- Motor shut-off valve open
- Tool kit and extra parts on board
